

Drone Flow So You Know

Are you flying your drone for fun or personal enjoyment purposes only?

You are a **Commercial Operator**, and you must follow these rules:

Be at least 16 years old.

Obtain a FAA Remote Pilot Certificate & Keep it with you.

Register your drone with the FAA

Mark your drone with its FAA Registration Number

Keep your drone within your visual line of sight.

Fly at or below 400 feet in uncontrolled airspace.

Fly at or below 400 feet in controlled airspace w/authorization.

Do not interfere with manned aircraft.

Do not fly at night without anti-collision lights.

Do not fly over people unless they are working with you.

Do not operate your drone in a reckless and/or dangerous manner.

You are a **Recreational Flyer**, and you must follow these rules:

Pass The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST)

Register your drone with the FAA

Mark your drone with its FAA Registration Number

Follow the rules of a Community Based Organization

Keep your drone within your visual line of sight.

Fly at or below 400 feet in uncontrolled airspace.

Fly at or below 400 feet in controlled airspace w/authorization.

Do not interfere with manned aircraft.

Do not fly at night.

Do not fly over people.

Do not operate your drone in a reckless/dangerous manner.
