Are you flying your drone for fun or personal enjoyment purposes only? YES -> You are a **Recreational Flyer**, and you must follow these rules: Pass The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST) NO Register your drone with the FAA Mark your drone with its FAA Registration Number You are a **Commercial Operator**, and you must follow these rules: Follow the rules of a Community Based Organization Be at least 16 years old. Keep your drone within your visual line of sight. Obtain a FAA Remote Pilot Certificate & Keep it with you. Fly at or below 400 feet in uncontrolled airspace. Register your drone with the FAA Fly at or below 400 feet in controlled airspace w/authorization. Mark your drone with its FAA Registration Number Do not interfere with manned aircraft. Keep your drone within your visual line of sight. Do not fly at night. Fly at or below 400 feet in uncontrolled airspace. Do not fly over people. Fly at or below 400 feet in controlled airspace w/authorization. Do not operate your drone in a reckless/dangerous manner. Do not interfere with manned aircraft. Do not fly at night without anti-collision lights. Do not fly over people unless they are working with you. Do not operate your drone in a reckless and/or dangerous manner.
